**When did this initiative launch?**

The GODAN initiative was announced at the Open Government Partnership Conference in October 2013 following discussions in 2012. Participants made commitments to Open Data for Agriculture at the International Conference on Open Data for Agriculture in Washington D.C. Subsequently, the governments of the United States and United Kingdom partnered to form this global initiative.

### GODAN Action

GODAN Action is a three-and-a-half-year programme launched by the UK's DFID. GODAN Action brings together agriculture and nutrition specialists and open data experts and will support GODAN in its mission by building people's capacity to engage with open data.

The project aims to contribute to increased farmers' yields, improved nutrition for consumers and better evidence based policy making. Achieving such impacts requires that individuals, organisations and communities feel confident in engaging with open data.

The activities of GODAN Action will focus on three areas including standards, research and capacity building. These focal areas will be supported by activities aiming at uptake of its results and monitoring & evaluation.

### What does it mean to be a partner?


